YOU ARE NEVER OUT OF A JOB!

You may be a log hauler, a contract logger, a chokerman, a donkey puncher, a timber cutter, or any of the two dozen and more jobs that go into the great industry of getting the tree from the stump to the dump.

You may be one of these logging people and you may not be doing the job you like best.

Yet you aren't out of a job.

It may have been weeks or it may have been months since you have worked at your chosen occupation. Yet you aren't out of a job.

You may expect me to come at you with the statement that you may still have the job of being a good citizen, of being a

husband and a father, of being a friend. That would be a good statement, and that is a continual job, but that isn't what I'm talking about.

WHEN YOU AREN'T WORKING AT YOUR CHO-SEN TRADE THEN YOUR JOB IS TO FIND A JOB.

Make no mistake about it. This can and should be one of the most important jobs there is. THE JOB OF FINDING A JOB.

I know many people out of work and they are looking for work. They are looking for work if they can stay where they are; if they can make \$15.00 an hour; if they don't have to get up too early, work too hard and spend too much time going to

Now that person has made his job a tougher job. He has made the job of finding a job almost impossible in this day and age. He won't find many takers when he puts all his personal exclusions into his search for employment.

When I was a logger I always felt sorry for one of my friends. He was a 100 pound overweight donkey punch-


er. That is all he looked for, a job running donkey. Usually over the years he found his job under his rules and with his exceptions tied to it.

Then there came a time and a day he couldn't and that man, 100 pounds overweight, had to go out and set chokers. He had to set chokers because that is all he could find. Was hard on him --- but not as hard as watching his family starve.

There is nothing as uncomfortable as having a bunch of hungry kids, with their hungry mother, around the house. They let you know where they hurt.

Another friend of mine who taught logging in a high school wanted me to help him start an employment agency to find jobs for his graduating students. My reply to him was along the lines that these people should not graduate until they had been taught how to find a job. We didn't need an employment agency we needed better teach-

As a man who has worked for about 5 dozen employers, as a man who was on the labor market during the great depression, as a man who worked for 25 cents an hour and was glad to get it, as a man who wandered



FINLEY HAYS

I have hunted jobs when they were easy to find and I've dug

them up when there was not a sign of a job. I have worked for the Salvation Army, I've washed dishes and I've walked up a street going from house to house asking to do yard work with my shovel, rake and hoe across my shoulder.

I've worked for a man who cut and sold wood. A ten hour day for \$2.00. He paid every night with a pair of precious silver dollars. Of that money 75 cents went for board and room, 25 cents went for two packs of Lucky Strike Cigarettes. The rest was put away for the 'bad times' coming.

In the fall of 1935 my friend and I went down a street in Oakland, California. We went into every store and business on that street. We asked over and over, 'Do you have a job I can do?' Within two hours he was working in a restaurant as a 'bus boy.' By nightfall I was working in a Transient Camp, as a second cook. My wages were room and board, \$5.00 a month spending money and all the work I wanted to do.

That was in 1935 --- that was in a depression. Now they didn't name that affair a 'depression'

Finley Hayes had talked to my dad Manny and I've been there ever since," Tom said.

As usual with a logger, a phone call at 5 a.m. in the morning gave him the news. His son James had heard from someone at the Deming Logging Show meeting that determined the 2018 Bull of the Woods. Apparently news

travels fast on CBs and word of mouth.

He's the seventh person in his family to get the Bull of the Woods title, and Tom has been a staple in Northwestern Washington Logging for a long time.

Also having got the award is Tom's grandad Robert Bob Zwick, Manny, two uncles, a cousin and his brother Gary VanDyk.

"I'm honored and flattered

to be named the Bull of the Woods and I'm really proud of how the show has done through the years," Tom said. "We're probably one of the bigger shows in the country now."

Tom began as the son in VanDyk and Son Logging, and now he's the VanDyk in the title. He graduated from Mt. Baker High School in 1966 and went to work for Alpine Logging Company as a choker setter making \$2.50 an hour.

Now? His company has a 45-foot TTY 45 yarder, two Doosans - a 300 and 225 - and three logs trucks. It's a family company with sons, relatives and in-laws working for Tom.

"The Doosans are nice machines, the price is right and they do the job," Tom said.

But back in his early days, Tom was just a guy on the rigging crew, going from Alpine Logging to Lloyd Barter Logging Company as a rigging slinger and hook tender for \$25. He then went to work for his brother, Gary VanDyke and Bill Blockley as a timber cutter.

In 1968, he married his high school sweetheart Glenda and then began skidding with Pete Nelson while also running a yarder. According to Tom, Nelson was a big mentor for him and the two had fond memories of working together.

Tom and Pete then began

logging at Shaw Island and VanDyk's family spent the summer living on the island. In the fall, the family moved back to the mainland and Tom got a Forest Service thinning job in Glacier.

Tom bought a John Deere 440 skidder with his dad and VanDyk and Son was born.

"I wanted to do it but I'm not sure how excited my dad was to do it as he had been in the industry for a while," Tom said with a laugh.

Manny retired in 1982 but Tom continued the company and has kept it in the family.

VanDyk and Son has worked Trillium Corporation, Crown Pacific, Goodyear and Weyerhauser, the company now features son James VanDyk and son-in-law Tony Grimes as partners. James and Tony runs the logging side while Tom manages the business, drives the short log truck and makes sure the other two trucks are road ready.

"We started thinning with the grapple skidder but gradually got into yarders," Tom said. "Towers are a necessary evil in our area, we having some really steep ground and it's not easy for a shovel to go around."

Still the company keeps a spare shovel around in case they can do some shovel logging on the jobsite. James VanDyk shovel logs while Tom's grandson Kyle is a rigging slinger as the sixth generation logger in the family.

James graduated from high school in 1987 and was getting into welding and working on trucks in Bellingham but then decided to go into logging. His son Kyle started out in a welding shop but then decided to log.

"I guess it's a blood thing," Tom said with a chuckle. "This is quite the family affair, sure we might but heads sometime but we usually get along."

For VanDyk and son, Hank Hartle is the hook tender and is like an adopted son along with choker setters Garth McCauley and Andrew Russell. The chaser is Kolby Williams. The yarder operator



VanDyk has been married to Glenda now for 50 years and she helps with the office and books in the company.








2018 Bull of the Woods - Tom VanDyk



LYME DISEASE

We usually think of Lyme Disease as an "East Coast" problem, but while it's not common in the west, it is here. Some of you may remember the article from 2017 that featured Jeff & Bev Heller and Jeff 's battle with Lyme Disease.

I recently received an email from Pierce Beigh, timber worker who is struggling with his recovery from Lyme disease. I think the best way to raise our awareness of the problem is for Pierce to share his own story.

I wanted to drop you a note regarding something that has effected my life greatly and I believe is going to affect many loggers/timber workers lives in the future

A bit of background on me. I was a rigging man under several different towers (TY90, Madill, Thunderbirds) in Pe Ell, Wa. for a few years, until I began training in harvest management. I was then sent to Weyerhaeuser Aberdeen camp to manage the company crews there.

In a matter of months I became extremely sick. I thought it was stress from work, so I kept pushing myself, but I eventually became so ill I couldn't make it through a day of work. I had to leave the job and search for healing answers. It wasn't until 5 months later that a doctor finally diagnosed me with lyme disease. I had been bitten by a tick in the woods and contracted the disease from the tick. Since then, 1.5 years, I have been out of work and struggling daily with debilitating symptoms. I believe now I am finally making improvements.


I am contacting you because I feel loggers need to know about this. I thought I was way too tough for a small tick to impact my life. But in fact that little tick brought me down complete-

ly. I wouldn't want anyone to go through what I have gone through, and if my experience can save a logger or forestry worker from years of pain, then I want to help.

My goal of this email is to somehow spread awareness to loggers and their families. This disease is uprising in western Washington for some reason and It will impact individuals lives as well as the timber industry economy. Im not one to fear the worst or to say 'the end is near!', but this disease really is debilitating. It took everything from me and I am just now starting to function normally again. I consider myself lucky as it can plague people for decades.

I deeply care about loggers and forestry workers. Its the best job in the world with the best people. Lyme disease is going to become a big issue in the next 5-10 years. I believe it's really important that we give loggers the knowledge now about what to look for symptom wise and how to reduce the risk of exposure. If I would have paid more attention and caught my symptoms a few months sooner, I would have been back in the woods with a short dose of pharmaceutical drugs. I was stubborn and pushed through, like most timber workers.


How to Remove a Tick



If you find a tick attached to your skin, there's no need to panic. Several tick removal devices are available on the market, but a plain set of fine-tipped tweezers will remove a tick effectively.

How to remove a tick

- 1. Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin's surface as possible.
- Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Don't twist or jerk the tick; this can cause the mouth-parts to break off and remain in the skin. If this happens, remove the mouth-parts with tweezers. If you are unable to remove the mouth easily with clean tweezers, leave it alone and let the skin heal.
- 3. After removing the tick, thoroughly clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol, an iodine scrub, or soap and water.
- 4. Dispose of a live tick by submersing it in alcohol, placing it in a sealed bag/container, wrapping it tightly in tape, or flushing it down the toilet.





Follow-up

If you develop a rash or fever within several weeks of removing a tick, see your doctor. Be sure to tell the doctor about your recent tick bite, when the bite occurred, and where you most likely acquired the tick.

Helpful Hint



Avoid folklore remedies such as "painting" the tick with nail polish or petroleum jelly, or using heat to make the tick detach from the skin. Your goal is to remove the tick as quickly as possible-do not wait for it to detach.

The price of lumber had almost

doubled from the time this sale

was purchased and when it was logged. You would think that the

sale purchaser could have spared

asked to bid a timber sale. We

were one of three bidders. We

were told that the good news was

that we were the lowest bid.

However, the bad news was that

our bid was higher than their an-

ticipated logging costs. We were

then asked to split the difference

between our price and theirs, or

they would rebid the sale. Looking back, I wish we would have

said not only no, but hell no!

There was about \$50,000 differ-

ence in our bid price and the

price we logged the sale for. However, we needed that money

a lot more than that timber com-

pany did. If you are going to put

things out for bid, then at least

a very complicated process. Us

loggers are quite capable of com-

ing up with numbers that are

lower then they should be. Espe-

cially if it is a sale that we feel

we need, to get us through the

slow time of the year. I think ev-

ery logger out there has been, at

some time or other, overly opti-

mistic about the production they

can get on a particular timber sale. Sometimes it seems like we are our own worst enemies. How-

Over the past couple of years, several CEO's of large timber companies, have expressed concerns about not having enough logging contractors to do the work needed. Who they are or who the concerns were expressed to are not important. They each followed a similar pattern. Deep concerns expressed about the aging and diminishing supply of qualified logging contractors! In each case, the reply has been that "loggers don't make enough money for the hardships they endure!" This is then followed by some blank stares and comments like "what are you talking about?"

It seems that the upper management of some timber companies are quite oblivious to the details of getting their timber logged and delivered to manufacturing facilities. I think that if they paid a little closer attention to their own processes of setting logging rates, that they would see that they are trying to have their cake and eat it too. To have high-quality logging contractors at rock bottom prices.

I must admit that, as a capitalist, I can completely understand this desire. The logging process is one of the major expenses of producing timber products. And, being a commodity, the value of those timber products is often set on a world market. In other words, the pie is only so big. So why not always get the lowest logging price you can? It's been working for quite a while.

I say go for it! Us loggers are big boys and girls. We just don't ever, ever, ever want to hear another complaint about there not being enough loggers!!!

Some timber companies have come up with some intriguing ways to get sales logged at "below bid prices." Just last year, we

ever, I have heard many stories about loggers being asked to reduce their price, to match a "really low bid" submitted by another logger.

One of the issues that loggers run into is how timber sales are managed. Sale management can make a big difference in profit margins. As one logger recently told me, "to get a nice timber sale, you have to bid it at maximum production, assuming that everything will go perfectly. Then as soon as you are awarded the sale, they start throwing roadblocks up that inhibit production". It's not uncommon to have a timber sale postponed at the last minute. To be told to pull out halfway through and come back later to finish it. To have more sorts added than were originally expected. Or to have quotas imposed that are lower than the production required, to produce a profit. All of these things and many others reduce the profitability of the loggers, of course, at no cost to the timber company.

Most of us loggers realize that we are not going to get rich working for timber companies. In most cases, we are just subcontractors. We have to work hard and be as efficient as possible to just get by. However, it would be nice to be treated fairly, in an open and honest process. Some of the CEOs of these timber companies might be surprised how hard their loggers will work for them if they were allowed to make enough profit to pay their employees what they deserve and live a decent life themselves.

As I said before, the pie is only so big. However, with the building boom that has been going on lately, the pie has been getting considerably larger. If loggers were to get a little bit larger piece of that pie, those same CEOs might be surprised how little it would hurt their profit margins. They might also find more loggers available to do the work needed.

Theft by Flooding – Feds Covet Then "Take" Church Land

Recently, the main stream media fawned over an "historic transition" in Cuba as Raul Castro "steps down" in favor of Miguel Diaz-Canel even as the reins are retained by Raul Castro's son Alejandro Castro-Espin, "a KGB-trained colonel in Cuba's secret police and a fanatical Stalinist." Pastor Victor Fuentes of Pahrump, Nevada, knows better because, just over 27 years ago, to escape Fidel's dictatorship and secure medical aid for his mother, he swam nearly 7 miles from Santiago, Cuba to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base seeking political asylum. Sadly, the past seven years have tested this proud citizen's faith in whether, unlike Cuba, America is a nation of laws and not of powerful men.

Today, Pastor Fuentes' church Ministerio Roca Solida (Solid Rock Ministry) is in a federal court in Washington, D.C. arguing the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service stole its water rights, diverted a stream that crossed its property, and, nearly annually for seven years, flooded its land damaging buildings, destroying property, and creating a moonscape. For their part, the agency, its officials and lawyers, and Justice Department attorneys say endangered species needed the water they took, the church is owed nothing, and its lawsuit must be dismissed. Little wonder Pastor Fuentes declares, "I am an immigrant from Cuba who risked death to escape Castro's regime ... only to be in a country overrun by a

federal government that reminds me of the horrors from which I fled."

Pastor Fuentes is no stranger to tribulation. Granted political asylum in early 1991, he was placed in Las Vegas where, desperate for the financial means to bring his mother to America, he sought aid from former Cuban nationals operating a drug distribution ring. They promised to help him if he helped them. He did, but it landed him in federal prison for three years. There, exposed for the first time to Christianity (Cuba was officially an atheist state when he fled), he was "born again," became a Christian, and swore his life to Christ. On release, he became an ordained minissin and redemption to youth on the streets of Las Vegas, and eventually, with his wife Annette's support (they married in 1995), formed his Church in Pahrump, Nevada.

It grew to over 70 souls, one of whom made it possible, in 2006, to purchase for \$500,000, a 40-acre parcel surrounded by Ash Meadows National Wildlife Refuge in Amargosa Valley, 30 miles from Pahrump. They called it Patch of Heaven because a spring-fed stream irrigated the trees and shrubs, provided water for a tranquil pond, and created, in Pastor Fuentes' words, "an oasis soothing to the soul and an ideal setting

gupon which to reflect upon God and His word." They spent over \$700,000 to repair buildings, restore septic systems, and realize needed improvements, most accomplished by Pastor Fuentes and church volunteers. The Church hosted retreats, Christian campers, and baptisms, but most importantly it was a refuge for troubled youths

from Las Vegas and others struggling with addictions.

In December 2010, the Church's neighbor, the Fish and Wildlife Service, without obtaining a Clean Water Act permit, without complying with the National Environmental Policy Act, and over the objections of a hydrological expert, diverted the stream onto its own land. Two days before Christmas, the newly re-routed waterway jumped its banks, sent a torrent of mud

and water across Patch of Heaven, and did over \$90,000 worth of damage. Flood waters came again three more times bringing the damage total to \$225,000. Because of the threat of seasonal flooding, repairs are futile, the grounds and buildings are virtually useless, and a dusty mini-Grand Canyon gashes through what was once lush wetlands.

Pastor Fuentes wants to know if the Constitution's words, "nor shall private property be taken for public use without just compensation," apply to a poor pastor, his tiny parish, and a church refuge in the desert of Nevada.



you would give to an unexpected, all paid for, hunt in South Africa.

Would you get excited about that? Would you be excited if I came to you and handed you a round trip ticket to Africa along with \$5,000.00 expense money? What would you do between now and when you got on that airplane 3 months from now?

Take that same feeling of excitement and expectations to the task of finding a job.

Do some thinking, make some plans, write down things so you can understand what you are hunting for, read, ask, seek and knock. If you are a Christian you may want to pray. If you aren't you may want a Christian

friend to pray for you.

The thing is that you do a good job of hunting for game. You look for tracks, you feel the ground, you use the sense of smell, you talk to the experts and above all you sight in that

That is the way to find a job.

Take the job of finding a job seriously.
